The Springfield Museums are comprised of four world-class museums: the Michele and Donald D'Amour Museum of Fine Arts, the George Walter Vincent Smith Art Museum, the Springfield Science Museum, and the Lyman and Merrie Wood Museum of Springfield History. The Museums are also home to the Dr. Seuss National Memorial Sculpture Garden, a series of full-scale bronze sculptures of Dr. Seuss' whimsical creations, honoring the birthplace of Theodor Geisel, a.k.a. Dr. Seuss.

Each museum is different and there is plenty to see, experience and appreciate! Along with the permanent collections and galleries, the Museums host major traveling art, history and science exhibitions. You'll always find something new!

During the summer, full- and half-day programs and courses for ages 5-16 are available on a range of topics from art and design to natural history and sciences. All classes are kept to 12 participants or less, and are designed to utilize the unique collections and facilities of the Springfield Museums. The museums also create memorable experiences for school age students by enhancing the schools' science, social studies, language arts or art curriculum. A broad range of programs for all grades and interest levels are offered.
