Hopkins School offers summer programs for students entering grades 3–12, with sessions running from June 26-August 4, 2017.

The Middle and Upper Summer school courses provide a wide variety of academic, enrichment and athletic courses for students entering grades 7–12 in the fall. The Upper School program offers SAT review and chess, as well as courses for academic credit and non-credit academic review. Enrichment courses are for students seeking to expand their horizons or strengthen core learning skills. For students entering 6th to 8th grade, courses in Expository and Creative Writing, Pre-algebra and Computer Programming are offered as well as academic classes focusing on web design and film. These classes are challenging, experiential and fun.

The Lower School program is an age-appropriate learning and enrichment program for students entering grades 3–6 in the fall. Courses in math, computers, reading, writing and chess are all available.

Sports programs are also a key part of the Hopkins Summer School experience. With options for boys and girls entering grades 3-12, sessions are available for squash, basketball, lacrosse, baseball and more.
